THIS WEEK'S LESSON: CEMENT



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Cement is made from special rock, clay, water and other materials all joined together in a cement mixer. The crowd at Pentecost was filled with many different people from different places. But when Peter shared the good news of Jesus, many of them believed. God mixed them all together to create the first church. Acts 2:1-14, 38-47, Many Are Saved



THANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Take another walk around the house. Where do you see cement? What other materials do you see holding your home together? Ask your kids how God uses the Holy Spirit to make believers stick together.



AT DINNER:
